My Flying Life



My Flying Life.

In 1958 I began to have thoughts of obtaining my Private Pilot's Licence. I went over to Cunderdin to the Aero Club where I flew a few hours in a Tiger Moth and didn't think much of it, possibly because it was winter, and it was cold and uncomfortable.

In February 1962, Ray Millard and Don O'Sullivan developed MOSA Aviation at Perth Airport. My first flight there was in a Pacer, followed by a Piper Tripacer. In these aircraft, I had found something I liked.

In August, I obtained my Pilot's Licence and converted to flying in a C150 Patrol model, followed by a 1956 Cessna 172. At this point, I had found love.

I had never liked horses, nor motorcycles or jeeps and mustering sheep at a farm I was developing west of Moora in an aircraft was sheer delight.

In 1966 I bought property east of Mukinbudin where I would hire aircraft from Airflight. Neighboring farmers would see me mustering out of breakaways and bush and quickly I was asked to do a bit for others who had similar country.

Not long after a note appeared on my door asking if I would consider piloting a new C172 given my ability to muster with no ground support. I began servicing properties at Mooliabeenee, Mount Dale and Waroona in addition to their mining and interstate transport operations.

It had been suggested to me by Instructor Bill Robertson while obtaining my PPL to regularly fly in competitions as a way of maintaining currency requirements for my licence. This was wise advice which I took on board and have flown in competitions ever since.


I flew for several years in the RAAFA Ceremonial Team, performing formation flyovers for numerous events. I also attend fly-ins all over Australia when the opportunity presents.

Since leaving full time employment, I began flying at Northam where I have always enjoyed the competitions and companionship and have finished well over the years. I don't get to every competition due to other travel plans, some in my own plane and others overseas. My love of flying has never waned, and I hope to stay in the air for many more years to come.



SANDY VOAK. (Nee - KIEL) 1941 - 2021.

Sandy moved to Northam in the late 1950's with her mother Maisie, older brother John and step father Arthur Couttes. They settled on a property near Seabrook.

She trained as a Ladies Hairdresser in a salon opposite Hailsham Chambers in Fitzgerald St.


She met and married John Voak and had two sons, Scott and Greg, a couple of "live wire boys" who kept she and John on their toes. They had a very good business which involved them erecting most of the TV Antenna towers for housing in the Central Wheatbelt. They both worked hard in extreme conditions, but always left customers satisfied with their work. After that they were involved in Airconditioning installations around the Northam area. Sandy was not afraid of hard work and spend a lot of time crawling around in ceilings installing ducting, usually in summer.

Both sons were involved in Model Aircraft and spent many hours flying with a group from a little airstrip alongside the Goomalling Rd on my property. Sandy gave them great encouragement. She was involved in the early days of the NAC and when ballooning started she became a great participant as a crew member. On ocassions she would be retrieve driver for Gren Putland. She had one problem with that job, she was not a competent reader of maps. I would often get a phone call from Gren saying that she was heading off somewhere and could I help out and get her back to where the balloon had landed. It had its hilarious moments.

As a crew member she became a big part of ballooning with Barry and Sylvia Bristow - Stagg. Many trips to the Seppeltsfield events, sorties to many other parts of Australia, a trip to France in 1983 for the World Championships and the 200th Anniversary of Manned Flight.

Sadly, in her latter years her health deteriorated, due in part to a lot of hard physical work in her younger days. She was a wonderful friend to many and will be missed. She always spoke highly of the Northam Aero Club and its members. She was also involved with Community groups in Northam in various capacities.


