

VALE—Belinda Clements

The Northam Aero Club and the Northam Ballooning Events have lost an active, dynamic, clever and tireless worker for the cause of aviation. Some of us have lost a friend, advisor, and person to keep us in touch with reality. Yet others have lost a mother, daughter and wife; with the passing of Bini. The events of such a short period of time are hard to comprehend.

Belinda Clements passed away on the 9th of March 2021. Bini was a tower of strength in her work for the aviation projects of the Northam Aero Club and Northam Ballooning Events teams. She was the energetic Honorary Secretary who made sure that tasks were completed and that the focus remained on the long-term endeavors. Bini was a pilot and recipient of an Aero Club scholarship, and wanted to have an influence on the Women's World Event planned for 2023. Her enthusiasm and dedication in crewing and giving back to aviation was unequalled. All of this was achieved with a degree of difficulty, because always 'family came first'.

Commitment to family was a hallmark of Bini's time with us. She would especially do anything for her (three) boys. School, sport, crewing and other family tasks all had a clear priority, before that remaining energy could be channeled to aviation projects.

We have lost a rare gem, and I expect we will all share the shock and sadness. Our heartfelt thoughts and prayers must go to that magnificent family that was so important to Bini's life.

Aerodrome markings

Everyone knows what a runway looks like. You know, that long straight, sometimes flat, sealed bit with piano keys and numbers and a dotted line up the middle, and trees, fences and powerlines at each end. But how well can you identify all the markings on an airfield? Runway and taxiway markings, strip markings, signs.

Edge (runway or strip) markings

The runway strip is an area including the runway and anything between 30 and 150 metres either side, and 30 to 60 metres at each end, that is nice and flat and obstacle-free, to reduce the risk of damage if you run off the runway, and to protect aircraft flying over it on takeoff, landing or missed approach.

Runway gable or cone markers are white. On an unsealed runway, especially grass, where there is a lack of contrast between the runway and the runway strip, the markers are put on the sides of the runway. If the difference between the runway and the runway strip is clearly defined (such as at Northam, with a sealed runway and grass runway strip), you don't need gable markers to show you where the runway is, so instead the markers are used to define the edges of the runway strip.

Incidentally, under RACWA's SOP's, an aircraft is not allowed to land if there is another aircraft within the runway strip. The holding point for Runway 14 at Northam is within the strip, so if you're taxiing to it, and you know there's someone on approach, you may choose to hold before the holding point so you're not within the strip.

If taxiway or apron edges are not clearly defined, yellow cones are used to mark the edges.

Runway markings

Numbers


As you know, runway designations are based on the magnetic heading of the runway, rounded to the nearest 10 degrees, which means you can check your compass on line-up. On parallel runways such as at Jandakot you'll also have an L, C or R as appropriate.

The exception is if the numbers may cause confusion, such as at Perth, where the runway with a magnetic heading of 016 is called 03, not 02. To have Runways 02 and 20 at an international airport would be asking for trouble.

Touchdown zone markings

On runways that have touchdown zone markings, the markings are most commonly as shown below. The first set, 3m wide, is 150m from the threshold. The second set, 6m wide on a 30m wide runway such as 06L/24R at Jandakot, or 9m wide on a 45m wide runway such as at Perth, is 300m from the threshold. The third set looks like the first set and is 450m in.




Displaced thresholds

Permanently displaced thresholds look the same as normal thresholds, with a white line and piano keys, but the thing to look for is the arrows pointing from the start of the bitumen to the piano keys. The usual reason is obstacles or higher ground on approach, such as at both ends of the runway at Northam, or 24R at Jandakot. All of the sealed surface is available for takeoff, but the landing area starts at the piano keys. Landing before that with a club instructor in the right- hand seat will cost you a six-pack on a normal flight, or a carton on a Flight Review.





Some RAAus News

RAAus Issued CASR Part 149 Certificate

RAAus is proud to announce the approval of our CASR Part 149 certificate which comes into effect on the 31 March 2021. RAAus is only the second Approved Self-Administering Aviation Organisation (ASAO) to be issued with a Part 149 certificate. This formal announcement comes following our recent board meeting where the Board of Directors ratified the final amendments to our Operations and Technical manuals for the implementation of Part 149.

It is very important that members are aware that new editions to the Operations Manual (Version 7.1.1) and Technical Manual (4.1) come into effect on the 31st of March 2021.

Part 149 simplifies the regulatory arrangements that have existed for many decades with sport and recreational aviation organisations through conditional exemptions from the standard aviation rules. CASR Part 149 brings more transparency, flexibility and certainty for the sector.

RAAus has dedicated a large amount of time and resource over the past 3 years to prepare for the application and implementation of Part 149. Much of this work included the overhaul of many internal and external documents and policies to align with 149 requirements, and also standardising and consolidating RAAus' processes and procedures.

RAAus has worked with CASA to ensure that Part 149 results in no material change or financial impost for members. This means that most members will be able to continue to operate with no change to their daily operations. Part 149 provides assurance to members that RAAus' processes and procedures are standardised and consistent, providing protection for both members and the organisation. It also further legitimises the framework under which we operate as an organisation.
